2021 began with lockdown preventing us from operating until May. Again the need for shielding and self isolation cut the number of available volunteers, but we also gained 2 new members. So, although we again held CSW over only 7 months, we managed to increase the number of sessions by 80% compared with 2020.

2021 saw an improvement in the percentage of motorists obeying the 30 mph speed limit, as well as in those exceeding the threshold for reporting to the police. This is excellent and can probably be wholly attributed to the excellent support provided by Special Constable Nick Froude over the past 6 months. His presence has clearly made people realise that speeding is being given serious attention. We look forward to working with him in 2022.



In 2020, we began participating in a pilot of an online support system provided by Community SpeedWatch UK. This was disrupted when Hampshire's existing "DOME" system stopped working, but was expected to restart again this year. However despite our positive feedback, the pilot was cancelled. I believe this decision was rather short sighted as adoption of the system would have enabled close cooperation across constabulary borders when dealing with persistent and excessive speeders. The system also provided useful scheduling tools and regular feedback on the results of our efforts. I hope the decision to cancel may be reconsidered at some future date.
