

Sway Community Speed Watch report dated 12/02/2022

This month we conducted 7 speedwatch sessions, reporting 46 speeding vehicles to the police. Highest speed detected was 42 mph.

Again, a higher volume of traffic was observed this month especially on the B3055 which is being used as a diversion route while the bridge at Holmsley is being replaced, however those speeding appear to have reduced. The difference in driving attitudes is very noticeable and may well extend to those times when he is not present.

What Vera Sees

Sway Parish Council's Vehicle Activated Speed Limit Reminder counts vehicles exceeding the 35mph reporting threshold. From this data we can extrapolate the total number of vehicles speeding through Sway each week. The chart below shows this, along with the 8 week rolling average trend line.
