2022 saw things getting more or less back to normal. We gained one volunteer, however only about half those registered to our group have been active this year.

2022 saw further improvement in the percentage of motorists obeying the 30 mph speed limit, as well as a further reduction in those exceeding the threshold for reporting to the police. This is excellent and happened despite there being no police presence at any of our sessions. It may possibly be explained by the increasing number of cars on the road that have speed limiter technology. If so, then we might hope for further improvement next year.
